

Hunger and Hunger-Related Issues (Nonfiction)

- *Starving in the Shadow of Plenty* (1982) – Loretta Schwartz-Nobel
The author spent seven years interviewing a wide variety of people across the country, all of whom detail their experiences living with hunger.
- *Growing Up Empty: The Hunger Epidemic in America* (2002) – Loretta Schwartz-Nobel
The sequel to *Starving in the Shadow of Plenty*, Schwartz-Nobel again allows people living with hunger to describe their experiences in their own words. This book is a call to action.
- *The War on Hunger: Dealing with Dictators, Deserts, and Debt*(2003) – Ron Fridell
describes the conditions that cause hunger across the world and in the United States, and details steps being taken to address the issue.
- *Toward an End the Hunger in America* (1998) – Peter K. Eisinger
This book qualifies the crisis of hunger in the United States, discusses the method with which the government defines hunger, and details short-term solutions to the problem.
